The resource person for the seminar was one of the renowned and eminent advocates from Ratnagiri, Mrs Swara Mayekar Madam. She has been a counsellor for the "SAKHI" One Stop

Centre, Ratnagiri, an initiative by the Ministry of Women and Child Development, State Government of Maharashtra for the last three years.

The seminar started with various legal provisions and acts introduced by the government to prevent violence against women in society. She explained the various facilities provided by SAKHI" One Stop Centre. Like a Police helpline, temporary stay arrangements are provided for girls, and women, legal advice, medical help etc. She also shared information related to various women's acts/laws which could be helpful in day-to-day life. Swara Madam shared household acts, live-in relationship acts, and cybercrime acts in a very precise but simple manner. She narrated day-to-day life examples, related to a legal right, and cybercrime which is more common nowadays. She explained the laws against sexual harassment in society, what needs to be done and what should not be done when such a case happens. Swara Madam also explained one important thing that, the legal laws are for protection against violence and not for taking advantage of it in any case, by imposing false allegations on anyone.
